Sunday, April 24, Tour the Newly Rehabilitated Arcade Building Downtown—

Constructed in two stages between 1906 and 1919 and designed by Eames & Young and Tom P. Barnett respectively, the massive Arcade Building is the latest example of large-scale reinvestment in downtown’s historic architecture. Redeveloped by Minnesota-based Dominion after a long period of abandonment, this grand historic building now contains a mix of residential, institutional, office and retail space. Slated to officially open in mid May, come take a tour ahead of the crowds with lead project architect Paul
